I am pleased to present our annual report for the year 2023-2024. This report will give glimpse of our major programmes and activities carried out during this year. PRASAR with the support of ChildFund Barnfonden Sweden- Strengthening civil society Organizations (CSOs) towards fostering women empowerment in Eastern Uttar Pradesh, promotion of safe abortion with support of Ipas Development Foundation and Ensuring Access to Justice for Children (A2J)– Phase – II is an initiative of Kailash Satyarthi Children's Foundation US.

PRASAR has been engaged in strengthening the small organizations and women & adolescent girls' groups for bringing about positive change in the society where the marginalized community can have access to the social and economic entitlements meant for them. The interventions are participatory so that the demand for development comes from the affected community as a result strong Mother & Adolescent groups at GP level in the operational villages in district Barabanki have emerged. For achieving the tangible and sustainable development, the target groups are to be empowered for availing opportunities and asserting their rights and entitlements. We further have taken initiative to strengthen various decision making bodies and committees at GP level such as- Village Health, Sanitation and Nutrition Committee (VHSNC), School Management Committees (SMC) and Matritwa Samiti for their effective functioning. We have also focused on building the capacities of our field level staff members through various training and orientation programs. Also, strategically we like previous year have planned to phase out 6 previous villages and accordingly phase in 6 new villages in the operational villages of district Barabanki. We completed this year in all the 10 district Barabanki, Lucknow, Shrawasti, Baharaich, Sitapur, Lakhimpur, Shahajahpur, Hardoi, Unnao and Kanpurt the promotion of safe abortion with support of **Ipas Development Foundation** and to implement Girls Icon Program which aims at promoting adolescent girls 'health and education rights We are all set to enter into new partnership **with ChildFund India** to implement the project “Strengthening CSOs towards fostering Women Empowerment” in 15 villages of block Masauli, district Barabanki through promoting gender equality, climate change informed agriculture and digitalization of the entire process of the project through Women Farmers Group and establishing Farmers Producer Company.

Strategically more focuses have been laid on precautionary measures along with preventive ones. For this educating adolescent girls and young women who are the future mother about reproductive health, personal cleanliness and hygiene and help them develop communication and decision-making skills so that may lead a healthy reproductive life. This will help to reduce the major hindering in the way of women empowerment and healthy growth of their children especially girls.

I owe my great and deep attitude to my team members stood by the organization in the pursuit of our mission. Finally, I take this opportunity to thank our financial supporters, ChildFund Barnfonden Sweden and Ipas Development Foundation who have all extended the financial and the moral support and have become partners in our endeavors.

# Organization Profile

## Background

*PRASAR* has accomplished a longish journey of development activism spanning over one and half decade - beginning with as an isolated individual endeavor, fighting adverse social conditions for bringing about a change through limited range of essentially educational activities with the marginalized and excluded communities in Barabanki district of Uttar Pradesh. Initially it was largely a lucky-go-happy affair in all intent and purpose, until the advent of The Hans Foundation (THF) in 2011 with its comprehensive package of organizational and programmatic support in the form of 'Maternal and Adolescent Health Care Program'. Precisely, ten years of this partnership with THF enabled the organization to develop organizational and financial systems, technical expertise & human resource, community organizations and expanding our outreach. Today, our portfolio encompasses diverse areas of maternal and adolescent health care, WASH (Water, Sanitation and Hygiene (WASH), nutrition, agriculture-based livelihoods, women empowerment, social inclusion etc.

## Statement of Vision, Mission and Objectives

### Vision

Achieving social democracy to guide the efforts for human development by addressing socio-economic inequality & deprivation and climatic imbalance

### Mission

Enabling the poor & the marginalized to end poverty through interventions in critical disciplines of health & nutrition, education and climate-resilient agricultural livelihoods

### Objectives

- Enabling the poor and the marginalized communities, particularly women & adolescents, to squarely face challenges, and avail opportunities by outspreading the provisions of crucial services like health care – reproductive, and child health, education & nutrition, safe drinking water, sanitation and hygiene etc.
- Creating conditions of climate-resilient agricultural livelihoods by developing necessary skill and resources, facilitating access to capital and establishing market linkages
- Addressing inequality in socio-economic conditions engendering carbon-intensive lifestyle, and safeguarding earth's finite resources and ensuring environmental sustainability

## Partner Communities and their Organizations

The communities/groups supported by the organization belong to the poor and economically marginalized sections. They are predominantly landless - living on scarce wage employment, largely drawn from the erstwhile untouchable Scheduled Castes and backward communities, including minorities. The programmatic activities remain focused on women and adolescent girls, besides the elderly and differently-able people.

The organization has kept alive its presence among the partner communities through development and mentoring of their organizational structures. For instance, in Barabanki, we have duly empowered women farmers' groups, 68 in number, with a membership of 1,532, leading to the formation of a farmers' producer company. On the other

hand, we have vibrant health groups of women (145), girls (145) and men (28). Similarly, in Pratapgarh, total number of 137 community-based organizations (CBOs), comprising health groups (24), women self-help groups (59) and children's groups (05) continue to be vibrant. The CBSs were further organized into a block-level federation, namely, '*Jan Adhikar Manch*'.

## **Geographical Coverage**

The organization has largely been focused on keeping the activities limited to central and adjoining eastern districts of the state. Accordingly, we have strong presence in most of gram panchayats/villages of all the development blocks of Barabanki. Besides, the eastern districts of Bahraich, Shravasti, Sitapur, Lakhimpur, Shahajapur, Hardoi, Unnao, Sitapur, Lucknow, in addition to Pratapgarh & Bijnor have also been on the map of our organizational activities.

## **Partnerships**

We are open to wide ranging partnerships involving village institutions, private/public sector companies, government & non-government agencies & networks, UN bodies etc. striving to endorse and deliver pro-poor, gender-just, inclusive and climate resilient development. Over the years of our strides, there has been partnerships with The Hans Foundation, DFID (PACS), Child Fund India, Care India, Azim Premji Foundation, Milan Foundation, Ipass Development, Foundation, SBI Life Insurance, State Tobacco Control Cell, Kailash Satyarthi Children Foundation US. etc.

The organization is also a part of networks like SATHI-UP, UP Forces, Uttar Pradesh Voluntary Health Association (UPVHA), Uttar Pradesh Voluntary Action Network (UPVAN), Alliance for Immunization and Health, Men's Action for Stopping Violence Against Women (MASVAW), Forum to Engage Men (FEM), SAHYOG, Lucknow etc.

- Maternal and adolescent health, education and nutrition
- Safe drinking water, sanitation & hygiene

- Women empowerment: Mobilization and participation in education and employment
- Development of girl child
- Climate-resilient agricultural practices and generation of livelihoods

# Strengthening Civil Society Organization Towards Fostering Women Empowerment in Eastern U.P.

The Child Fund support has been an assay of the organization in organizing the women of excluded and backward communities and building their capacities. The intervention led them to achieve the identity of ‘women farmer’ and ‘agro-entrepreneur’.

Besides identifying and organizing a relatively large group of 1,532 women from across 15 villages of Masauli block in Barabanki district, great number of them were initiated into sustainable agriculture practices from the perspective of climate-resilience, gender-justice and, above and beyond, entrepreneurship development through convergence and field-based demonstrations and trainings. In addition, many of the women were led to begin vermicomposting.

With all the incumbents, an outfit – ‘*Agro-Prasar* Farmers’ Producer Company’ – was evolved with as many as ten Board Members drawn from their ranks. The organization, moreover, facilitated the issuance of four licences to these women for pursuing fertilizer, seed, pesticide business and trading in *krishi mandis*.

PRASAR has gained experience in addressing the crucial subject of climate change and its impact on agriculture and have focused on mitigating environmental challenges, promoting sustainable farming practices.

- Due to this project good liasoning with govt department have been developed.
- The project has enhanced skills and knowledge in improving documentation and reporting practices for greater effectiveness and accountability.
- Registration of Agroparasar Farmer Producer Company Limited with all statutory compliances.
- Capacity building of CSOs and women farmers through digital platforms.

- Climate friendly agriculture-Integrated Farming system, Mixed and Multi cropping, Organic farming, SRI and DSR

## Lessons learned

- a) By providing adequate awareness, inspite of being illiterate or less educated women farmers, they can be empowered to raise their voice for their rights and strive for equality, ultimately leading to women's empowerment.
- b) Digital platform helps in finding new market opportunities and better price of their crops while delivering valuable information and resources to optimize their productivity and profitability.
- c) The involvement of husbands and other male family members plays a crucial role in advancing gender equality and empowering women.
- d) The participation of government officials has led to women's aspirations for the program.

## Collaboration and Partnerships

- Women farmers have forged stronger relationships with government departments.
- Women farmers are actively engaged and making remarkable contributions with the help of agriculture, horticulture, Panchayati Raj, ICDS, health, and forest department.
- Government departments (Agriculture ,Horticulture, Jila Udyog Vibhag) have provided training on various topics, empowering individuals with valuable knowledge and skills.
- The District Magistrate and Chief Development Officer have recognized the Agroparasar Farmers Producer Company and lauded the efforts of women farmers, providing them with updates on various beneficial schemes.
- Women farmers have actively participated in events organized by government departments, where they not only showcase their active engagement and commitment to agricultural development but also promote their Farmers Producer Company to a wider audience.

## Impacts

- **Sustainability of best practices:** The demonstration plots showcasing System of Rice Intensification (SRI), Direct Seeded Rice (DSR), integrated farming, organic farming, and climate-friendly agriculture will continue to inspire and will be replicated by farmers in the community.
- **Improved agricultural practices:** Farmers who have learned and implemented these best practices will continue to reap the benefits, such as increased crop yields, reduced water usage, minimized chemical inputs, and improved soil health.
- **Knowledge dissemination:** The knowledge and skills acquired through training programs and resources provided by the project will be shared among community members, creating a multiplier effect as farmers pass on the information to others.



- **Sustainable farming systems:** The establishment of kitchen gardens and vermicompost pits will continue to promote sustainable agriculture at the household level, ensuring access to fresh produce and organic inputs for farming.
- **Enhanced financial management:** The documentation practices implemented by the Farmers Producer Company (FPC), including maintaining cash books, ledgers, stock registers, and asset registers etc, will enable transparent financial management and serve as a model for other community-based organizations.
- **Continued women empowerment:** The project's focus on women empowerment will lead to lasting changes, such as increased participation of women in decision-making processes, improved access to resources and opportunities, and enhanced socio-economic status within the community.
- **Digital Inclusion:** Digital utilization in target communities will create lasting impacts by establishing enduring access to information, markets, and financial services. The knowledge acquired through digital platforms, adoption of e-commerce, and mobile banking will endure, enabling communities to sustainably improve their agricultural practices, economic opportunities.



## Community Engagement and Participation:

- Production of FPC products such as potato chips, mustard oil, Daliya, organic vegetables and nursery development.
- Adoption of SRI and DSR method of cultivation.
- FPC input resource center selling and purchasing of seed, fertilizers and pesticides etc.
- Creating vermicompost pits for organic waste decomposition and nutrient-rich soil production.
- Kitchen garden, cultivating fresh produce at home for a sustainable and convenient supply of vegetables.

## Gender capacity change since project

In earlier times, the concepts of "gender" and "women's rights" were unfamiliar, overshadowing the significant role of women farmers. Within the realm of agriculture, women faced marginalization, limited opportunities, and societal constraints that impeded their growth and advancement.

- Women farmers are now diligently advocating for equal emphasis on education and healthcare for their girls.
- Women farmers now actively participate in village activities and assertively demand their rights at both local and governmental levels. They break barriers, contribute significantly, and advocate for gender equality.
- Fearlessly approaching government departments, they emphasize the recognition and respect of their rights.
- 2 Gram Pradhan and 12 PRI members are women farmers from our project area.



## Climate change capacity

- a) Women farmers have adopted the SRI and DSR methods for cultivation.
- b) Women farmers have now embraced the practice of Integrated Farming.
- c) Women farmers are now actively engaging in organic farming practices
- d) Women actively cultivate kitchen gardens, demonstrating their involvement in sustainable food production and promoting self-sufficiency in fresh produce.
- e) Women farmers are taking the initiative to establish vermicompost pits, highlighting their dedication to sustainable agriculture and the utilization of organic fertilizers



# Ipas Grantmaking Program -Safe Abortion(SRHR)

PRASAR is an NGO based in Lucknow, Uttar Pradesh. We work with a range of target groups including adolescents, women in reproductive age, farmers and poor and deprived communities. Key activities include:

**SRHR and Abortion:** In one district of Uttar Pradesh, we worked with district and sub-district level health officials, women affiliated with self-help groups, members of local governing bodies, and other community-based organisations, women. PRIs, elective representatives, CSOs and networks to increase access to sexual and reproductive health services and safe abortion services. We sensitized several district level officials, media personnel and CSOs to create awareness and build a supportive environment.

**Water:** In 16 villages our efforts ensured access to safe drinking water for over 3000 people.

**Education:** We strengthened infrastructure of 40 government run schools by facilitating provision of tables and chairs in classrooms for approximately 4000 students.

**Women:** With our quality health service delivery, we assisted 86 women with successful treatment of infertility in district Barabanki.

Recent amendments in India's abortion law are intended to further increase access to safe abortion services, especially for vulnerable women. However, awareness among the community about the law and these recent changes is very low, especially in rural areas. As part of the Sanjha Prayas Network mentored by Ipas Development Foundation, PRASAR has been working in collaboration with other grassroots organisations to increase awareness in communities with a focus on local influencers and decision-makers-our approach has been effective in breaking social barriers and destigmatizing abortion in rural communities of 10 districts. Our advocacy efforts at the local levels have also ensured availability of abortion services in the public health system.

PRASAR is currently a **State Advisory Board (SAB)** member of the *Sanjha Prayas* Network in Uttar Pradesh. We therefore play a key role in coordinating the efforts of the network in Uttar Pradesh by enabling collaboration amongst grassroots organisations working towards a joint agenda of improving access and utilisation of SRHR services, especially abortion through government systems.

PRASAR has a deep-rooted understanding of local contexts that plays an essential role in sustaining abortion ecosystems. Along with organisation's presence in the state, PRASAR as experience of working and implementing the different health programmes in many areas such as SRHR, and capacity building of different stakeholders on different topics such gender, RCH and other community health topics.

Using a multi-faceted approach that will include leveraging the expertise and presence of the Sanjha Prayas members, the proposed program will work towards the following key objectives;

- Strengthen integration of safe abortion content and commitments into the agendas of civil society organisation.
- Transform social norms and practices that stigmatise abortion through community outreach messages.
- Sensitise critical community influencers and gatekeepers to the rights of young women, especially right to access safe abortion.

# Ensuring Access to Justice for Children (A2J)–Phase–II

## Background

Ensuring Access to Justice for Children (A2J)– Phase – II is an initiative of Kailash Satyarthi Children's Foundation US that is based on partnerships with Non-Governmental Organisations (PRASAR) across the country and is aimed to create a holistic and robust model for the prevention and elimination of child trafficking, child sexual abuse, and child marriage.

### *Some of the key objectives of the programme are:*

- Support Government agencies in protecting children from exploitation such as child trafficking, child labour, child sexual abuse and child marriage
- Build capacity of more than 1,000 social workers of NGOs in preventing and protecting children from exploitation
- Strengthen partnerships between PRASAR and Government agencies

## Experience of working on cases of Child Sexual Abuse, Child Marriage and Child Trafficking/Labour

1. Providing support to survivors of Child Sexual Abuse (CSA) to get their cases registered by the police, to ensure the suspected perpetrators are arrested and to support in the Legal Process through the trial in the court.
2. Provide Legal Counsel, who explain and guide families and survivors through the Legal Process, lodge FIR, Register victims for Compensation.
3. Case Intervention and Documentation.
4. Facilitating and supporting the survivors of Child Sexual Abuse (CSA) through registered their cases with the police, ensuring punishment to the suspected criminal and counselling with survivors and offering support throughout the legal journey.
5. Support service of Legal Counsel to the victim and their families and survivors, assisting in the crucial steps of filing First Information Reports (FIRs) and pursuing avenues for compensation for victims.
6. Conducting comprehensive case intervention and documentation to safeguard the rights and well-being of survivors, ensuring that every aspect of their experiences is sensitively recorded and diligently addressed.





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8. Support service of Legal Counsel to the victim and their families and survivors, assisting in the crucial steps of filing First Information Reports (FIRs) and pursuing avenues for compensation for victims.
9. Conducting comprehensive case intervention and documentation to safeguard the rights and well-being of survivors, ensuring that every aspect of their experiences is sensitively recorded and diligently addressed



## Activities

- Mapping of child marriage cases, informed concerned dept. and Plan to stop child marriage with the help of CWC, CMPO/DPO, Police, Childline and KSCF team.
- Undertaking in the presence of Panchayat/Police/Child Marriage Prohibition Officer.
- Providing support to the survivors of child marriage to get their case registered by the Police/FIR, to ensure suspected family members are arrested or present in front
  - of Child Welfare Committee.
  - Registered Victim for compensation or link with Govt. Social Security Schemes.
  - Provide Counselling and support to the children who have been sexually exploited and help them to reintegrate into their communities.
  - Awareness building at the community, school and PRI level.
  - Sensitizing Meetings with different Stakeholders like Police, AHTT, DPO, CWC, AAA, PRIs, SHGs/CPC, etc.



- Important Days Celebrations.
- IEC development and Dissemination.
- Linkages with different Govt. Programmes and Schemes

**We have covered 50 Gram Panchayats in Ayodhya districts of U.P. under A2J Project. Major Achievements are as follows.**

- Provided legal counseling to the survivors by guiding and explaining the cases, the legal processes, lodged FIRs, and registered victims for compensation.
- Provided support to 45 cases of Child Sexual Abuse.
- Formation and sensitisation of Adolescent/Women/SMCs/PRI's etc. on child protection issues.
